

Director's Notes

"Changing of the Guards" is a film that that is classic in its construction and contemporary in his characterization. It is a pleasure me for to write a film about a 69 year old man and to see that story come to life. At every stage of development, both pre and post production, I felt like the story began to form into something unique and very special. The themes of "pride of man" versus the "place of heart" are very important to me and to find a character to express these themes and interweave them into a story that is captivating for an audience is a delight. Roger and Tana, two Eversafe officers on Christmas Eve are such an unlikely couple. But this "unlikeliless" is something about the film I hope will capture both the hearts and minds of everyone who watches the film. In the same way that it doesn't profit a man if he gains the whole world but loses his soul, Roger is left with the question, "how does it profit a man if he keeps his pride intact, but loses his heart." I hope you will ask the same question at the end of the film.



Director's Bio: Joseph Robert Lee

Joseph is 24 years old. He has a bachelor degree in film directing from the School of Performing and Screen Arts at UNITEC in Auckland, New Zealand.

This is Joseph's second professional short film. His first was "Blood and Bone" which was made in 2004 with a grant from The Screen Innovation Production Fund in New Zealand. Another short film, the self-funded "Dawn Generation", won the Kodak Young Cinematographer of the Year Award in 2002 (New Zealand).

Joey can't stop writing and has at any time a million short film scripts going. One day, he'll make them all into features... Joseph currently works as a directing tutor at an Auckland polytech.

Key Cast, Crew, Location, Production notes

"Changing of the Guards" was funded through the New Zealand Film Commission's short film scheme. Each year 3 "pods" are nominated to choose and executive produce 3 short films each. Joseph and Kristian were chosen based on their previous short film "Blood and Bone".

The film was shot mostly in a rural location 35 minutes outside of Auckland – New Zealand's largest city. The petrol station scenes were shot over three nights at a working petrol station. The locals let us use the next door elementary school as a base and the local fire brigade turned up for free to help us with wetdowns. If only every location was that friendly!

The lead actor, Chic Littlewood, is one of New Zealand's most beloved children's television hosts. He had his peek during the seventies and early eighties with his shows Chicaboom and ChicChat and often shared the screen

with Willie McNab – a cheeky young puppet. Many of the older crew were ecstatic by the thought of working with their childhood idol.

The company received funding from the New Zealand Film Commission to make the film.
