LOGLINE

Playing dress ups can't always disguise a not-so-perfect reality.

ONE LINER

When a blossoming friendship threatens to expose a young mother's make-believe world of bumble bees, tigers and wolves, she must find the courage to face her not-so-perfect reality for the sake of her daughter.

SHORT SYNOPSIS

Ana fights to create a fantasy world for her daughter in a bid to shield her from the pain of a past relationship. But an unexpected friendship shows Ana that she can merge her not-so-perfect reality with the make-believe world she has created for her child.

SYNOPSIS

Every week day, Ana and her three-year-old daughter dress in a different animal outfit and go to school in their own little world, catching the train and ignoring the judgmental stares from the outside. Tuesday is wolves and Friday is tigers. When Ana drops Nellie at Kohanga Reo school (*total immersion Māori language school*), she secretly swaps her costume for regular clothes and her not-soperfect reality.

Caught in a dysfunctional on-again off-again relationship with Nellie's father, Ana struggles to deal with his addiction while trying to protect her child. When a blossoming friendship with a fellow medical student threatens to expose her make-believe world, she must find the courage to face her past for the sake of her and her daughter's future.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Friday Tigers is a charming but honest story about the harsh reality of life and the lengths we go to conceal the truth from ourselves.

It asks, how far will a parent go to protect their child and is it possible to separate the good, bad and dysfunctional aspects of our lives?

The film reveals the devastating effect of addiction on those we love and the need to take control of one's own destiny.



DIRECTOR'S BIOGRAPHY

AIDEE WALKER (DIRECTOR/WRITER)

Aidee Walker has worked consistently in New Zealand film, theatre and television for the past decade since graduating from The School of Performing and Screen Arts at UNITEC in Auckland. She is most well known for her acting role as Draska in popular New Zealand television series Outrageous Fortune. After returning to New Zealand from years living, performing and studying abroad, Aidee began to write and perform her own work and soon made the transition to writing and directing film. Her first short film, The F.E.U.C, screened successfully at The Show Me Shorts Festival, NZ and has been accepted into the Palm Springs International Film Festival. She has recently completed her second short, Friday Tigers, which received funding under the New Zealand Film Commission's Fresh Shorts Scheme.

Most recently Aidee has had acting roles on NZ television series Sunny Skies and feature film How to Meet Girls from a Distance for which she was a finalist in the Best Supporting Actress category at the MOAS. In 2012, Aidee co-led a committee that organised an NZ charity bike ride from Bluff to Cape Reinga called 'Ride Out of the Blue' in which she also participated. She is currently developing a TV series, Animals, as well as several short and feature film projects with writer/actress Shoshana McCallum.
