# Director's biography

Patrick is currently based in Wellington, New Zealand. In late-1997, he completed his first short film, Lemi's Comic Strip Capers (16mm, 12½mins), with a NZ\$12,000 production grant from Creative New Zealand. Since then, Lemi's Comic Strip Capers has featured in the 1999 Christchurch Festival of Romance, and screened on Television New Zealand's Tagata Pasifika.

In early-1999, he completed his second short film, the self-funded Admit One (35mm, 4mins), with post-production funding from the New Zealand Film Commission. Since then, Admit One has screened in independent cinemas throughout New Zealand, and was selected for Official Competition in both the 1999 Montreal World Film Festival and the 1999 Palm Springs International Short Film Festival. In January 2001, Admit One was picked up for internet and non-theatrical distribution by US-based Atom Films (www.atomfilms.com).

# Director's biography cont...

In September 1999, Patrick was one of twelve New Zealanders to be awarded a NZ\$3000 AMP scholarship. This prize money went towards the production of his debut no-budget feature film, entitled Offensive Behaviour. Offensive Behaviour was shot on Digital-Beta and Super16mm film in early-2000, and has received an offer of international distribution from Troma Entertainment Inc.

In early-August 2002, Patrick completed his third short film Kitty (35mm, 5mins), with the assistance of a NZ\$18,000 production grant from the Screen Innovation Production Fund (part funded by Creative NZ and the NZFC) and post-production funding from the New Zealand Film Commission. Recently, Kitty has been selected for Official Competition in the 2002 Montreal World Film Festival, as well as being invited to screen at the 2002 London Film Festival.
