WRITERS'S NOTES

Preferably Blue is a bittersweet fairytale that your parents would never have read to you before bedtime. Their fear that you may turn out to be a bitter adult, knocking back anti-depressants like they were liquorice allsorts, if you didn't get what you wanted for Christmas, was probably the reason.

Based on real events, it's the story of how the Easter Bunny managed to stop drinking and found peace, joy, and a good friend. It's also the story of Santa. We all know that "modern shopping mall" Santa is just some guy dressed up in a musty, damp, sweaty red suit. But ours the story of the real Santa, who was indeed a very nice chap, but lonely. Oh so lonely.

Together, Santa and Easter Bunny will discover the true meaning of Christmas, which, surprisingly, is getting a Banana seat bike.

Before when I said that *Preferably Blue* is based on real events, I didn't mean Santa and Easter Bunny, because they're not real. But when I was young all I wanted was a banana seat bike and I never got one. I got models of tractors instead and that made me miserable. Every Christmas the Bromley family who lived next door would be riding around on their new bikes, and I'd watch them from inside, pushing my dumb tractor up and down the windowsill.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When I first read this story I immediately thought what a great, fun little film it would make. I imagined it being played on TV at Christmas and Easter time every year, but as something that was quite different than the usual holiday fare.

Preferably Blue is a dark yet humorous tale. The story is delivered as a classic Fairytale-type poem, adding interest to this are the contemporary cultural cues.

It's the timeless story of a character's personal and moral redemption, made modern.

What I wanted to do with *Preferably Blue* was to create a world in which the somewhat sordid life of the Easter Bunny (and even Santa) is believable, so it's not your traditional cartoon environment but a place where real "human" things happen to our make believe characters. By doing this I feel we can empathise with the protagonists as they battle their inner demons, for they reflect, in many ways, our own.

DIRECTOR'S BIOGRAPHY

Alan is the founder and owner of Yukfoo Ltd. He has been working in New Zealand as a professional animator since 1999. Previous to this Alan worked as a professional animator in the UK for 6 years. Alan has worked on feature films, TV commercials, and music videos.

Alan's main focus whilst working in New Zealand and starting Yukfoo has been in the realm of TV commercials. Where he has directed over 100 commercials for clients such as Vodafone, ANZ, HP, Smirnoff, Subaru, Air NZ, Qantas, Playstation and NZ lotteries. In the past couple of years Alan has become a little fed up of TV commercials and their sometimes unbearable demands. Due to this Yukfoo has started to develop a wider interest in other formats within animation. The ultimate goal is to move in to feature film production. For now Alan is happily developing IP for children's series ideas, other short film projects and helping out with the odd music video. Alan has also been active in developing young directors and talented artists and designers through his studio.

Alan is an ambitious person who can inspire and encourage a team. He has won many accolades in the advertising world and a few in other worlds too. It is his goal to produce a feature film sometime in the near future. I think most of all, Alan is truly passionate about film and especially animation.

Wain has always written for a living, apart from the time he was a fisherman for two years in Norway; And then there was that time that he studied environmental science. But that didn't really go anywhere because Saatchi & Saatchi NZ gave him a job.

For about 12 years Wain has worked for Saatchi & Saatchi NZ and Singapore, Y&R in Melbourne and London, some other smaller, lesser known, but more creatively satisfying and less politically hostile advertising agencies, and currently writes advertising for 42 Below Vodka, and ferrit.co.nz. Wain worked as a storyliner and script editor on Shortland Street, probably about 8 years ago.

One story that Wain wrote was turned into a short film called "Deleros". Directed by Adam Stevens. (Wain's story was better than the film.)

Wain is currently talking to Harper Collins about getting a book of black, adult, fairy stories with a moral printed and in the shops.

Wain wrote and directed a "mini-soap" for Cream TV's Kiwifruit show which was targeted at a Gay and Lesbian audience. The mini soap was called "Boring Old Gay Guys." A reviewer in the Listener said that 'Boring Old Gay guys' deserved it's own half hour show. If only reviewers ran TV.

Wain loves movies. He's currently writing one. He just needs the time to make it better.
