Director's Notes

Mihi atu ki nga kaipanui e hangai ana ki te kaupapa nei.

When I first read Phil Kawana's short story, I became haunted by it. How could something so terrible be so beautiful? Like many of Phil's stories from his two collections they are bleak, raw and most potently they are crafted in an authentic voice that makes you wonder - how does he know these things happen? Phil was born and raised under Maunga Taranaki, his books sit alongside other taonga in the display cabinet in Te Niho o te Atiawa at Parihaka pa. He is one of my favourite writers.

Pana Hema-Taylor came into acting through through a high school teacher who was able to introduce to Pana a skill and maybe a vocation that he could shine in. He took him away from a world of violence, crime, drugs and a predestined path as a gang member. Within moments of putting my first frame on Pana in the maori language soap opera **Whanau** I knew that he was something extraordinary. Here was Zig, a boy at 16 who already knows far too much, has seen far too much and most importantly radiates a freshness, a purity that is innate. And therein lies the two opposing forces of this story; corruption and purity; violence and aroha; isolation and intimacy; sacred and profane; tapu and noa. It is these opposing energies that craft this piece of cinema.

The performances in **Redemption** are startling and express an extraordinary relationship so purely based on aroha – its honesty and pureness underpinned by violence and pain. I hope to leave audiences as haunted as I was when I first came across **Redemption**.

Redemption is love story, a coming of age story, a Maori story, a Taranaki story. This is my first Maori film and the connection I have to the material has been with me many years. It is not my story but a story I connect to.

Ka whawhai tonu matou.

Producer's Note - Rachel Jean

Katie and I began this journey when we had just returned from the Sundance Film Festival where her first short film **This Is Her** gained a fantastic response.

While at Sundance a fabulous event happened – in a raffle I won a US\$25,000 prize in production, post production sound and digital services from NBC/Universal towards making a film. The only trick was that it must be used before the end of 2009. I made a deal with Katie that she could use it on a project that moved her, and one that would be most unlikely to find funds elsewhere. In other words - an exceptional, innovative, non-commercial film.

She chose **Redemption**.

As you can tell by reading her Director's Notes, this is a story that moved Katie from the first reading. My response to reading the script was similar. It is incredibly simple, so utterly tragic, and extremely beautiful. Redemption. I love the complexity of the word – liberation, yet freedom purchased with payment of sacrifice.

Being Maori herself, Katie has brought cultural specificity to the story but she has made this is a universal story of abuse, love, survival and finding redemption.

Director's Bio

Katie Wolfe is from Taranaki and is Ngati Tama, Ngati Mutunga and Pakeha.

She has been involved in the New Zealand performing arts and screen industries for the past 15 years. She has a BA majoring in English and Drama and also trained as an actor at Toi Whakaari, the New Zealand Drama School.

Katie's first short film *This Is Her* won her short filmmaker 2008 at the New Zealand Film Festival. Since its completion in May last year the film has been officially selected for Sundance, Edinburgh, Melbourne, Telluride, and New York Film Festivals. It won Best Audience Film Award at Prague Film Festival and Best Short Film at the St Tropez Antipodes Film Festival, as well as being a finalist in all short film categories at the NZ Qantas Film & TV Awards, winning best cinematography. The film was funded through the NZFC pod scheme under Combrio Shorts.

The New Zealand Drama School graduate has also become an award-winning theatre director with productions like *The Women,* (Chapman Tripp best new director), *Plenty* by David Hare, & the Catherine Downes written production of *The Case of Katherine Mansfield.*

Katie has now cemented herself as a director of television. She began directing for television on *Shortland Street*, which she consequently produced. She was the establishing director on TV 2's latest primetime drama *Go Girls*.

Producer: Rachel Jean

Rachel Jean has been producing drama and documentary for large and small screen for more than a decade. Working in New Zealand, for many of the leading production companies, she has spent time on the WIFT executive (Women in Film & TV Association) and has been on the SPADA executive committee (Screen Production and Development Association).

Her experience in production has ranged from short films, corporate videos, commercials, television drama and documentaries to feature film production.

In 1995 Rachel line-produced three one hour dramas, Niki Caro's *Plain Tastes*, Jonathan Cullinane's *Trifecta* and Jess Hobbs' *Overnight*, and was associate producer on another drama, Fiona Samuel's *Home Movie* which immediately proceeded being associate producer on Niki Caro's (*Whalerider*) first feature *Memory & Desire*.

During the last decade Rachel has produced a broad range of short films. *Old Bastards* directed by Niki Caro, *Black Bitch* directed by Annalise Patterson and *Testdrive* directed by Mark Summerville, were all funded by Creative New Zealand. *Headlong* directed by Simon Raby, *The Road Back* directed by Annalise Patterson and *Philosophy* directed by Geoffrey Cawthorn were funded by the New Zealand Film Commission.

Rachel also Executive Produced with Owen Hughes a Short Film Tender for the New Zealand Film Commission over two years, producing seven films; *Trust Me, Camping With Camus, Falling Sparrows, Watermark, The hill, Honey,* and *Waterwoman*.

Since then Rachel has produced a one-hour television drama for TV3, *Love Mussel* directed by Michael Hurst and starring Kevin Smith, 2 seasons (26 episodes) of a half-hour children's drama series *Secret Agent Men* for Greenstone Pictures, a 13 part drama series called 'The Market', and a 6 part half hour drama series *Ride With the Devil* both for TV2.

Rachel has recently become Head of Drama and Comedy for Mediaworks (TV3 & C4).

However Rachel is still committed to developing directors of drama, towards a long-term goal of feature film production, and currently has a few feature films in development with NZFC support.
