GREG JOHNSON & JOHN LEIGH WRITERS / PERFORMERS

Greg and John are two of New Zealand's most well-known stage and screen actors.

Over his 30-year career Greg has appeared in projects as diverse as The Piano, Outrageous Fortune and Hercules, and was awarded a New Zealand Film Award in 2011 for his role in the acclaimed independent feature film The Insatiable Moon.

John has had an equally far-ranging career, from Power Rangers and The Lord of the Rings, to long-running NZ serial Shortland Street and Peter Cook biopic Not Only but Always.

Snowmen is their first script. It was born out of a love of comedy, a shared history of late nights that are a little bit hard to remember, and far too much spare time.

PRODUCTION NOTES

Snowmen was shot over four days, predominantly in a blacked out Auckland Kiwifruit packing facility.



The refrigerated environment saw the cast and crew shoot in temperatures ranging from 10 degrees to a chilling -5 degrees celsius. This created condensation of breath and authenticity of performance from our lead actors, to sell the idea of Bryan and Barry being stuck in a vast world of ice.

It was shot on the Sony F65 with anamorphic lenses, mounted onto a technocrane allowing a full range of movement.
