Long Synopsis

Most days Evan rides the bus all over town rather than face another day at school. He feels at home by himself, lost in his thoughts and drawings, watching the city roll past the window. But one wet day he notices a slightly older, beautiful girl steal a wallet before jumping off the bus. Romy seems like the embodiment of everything he daydreams about: excitement, rebellion and sex. He is instantly fascinated and ends up following her. A tentative friendship emerges as they journey across the hinterland of the city, killing time and having fun. Evan thinks he has found a companion that understands him, but he soon learns that he doesn't understand Romy at all.

Director's Notes

When you're young you can make and lose friends very quickly; usually because you're still figuring out who you are yourself and how you fit in the world. "Truant" is an unrequited love story between two lonely young people. It is about the things we learn that make us adults; Evan may be skipping school, but he is being taught a life lesson. By the end of the story he might have been hurt, but he knows more about himself and the world, and in an emotional sense has grown older.

As Heather Menzies developed the script, I felt as though it was in fact an archetypal story, and that similar episodes could have occurred in many people's adolescence. With this in mind I wanted to approach the production of "Truant" as though it were a memory of the events, rather than the events themselves. When I remember stories in my life they come to me in a jumble – snatches of images and words and sounds that I piece together in my mind to try to make sense of. I hoped to mimic this feeling of remembering in the way we put the film together.

I was lucky enough to work with talented people such as Aaron Morton (DOP), Jonno Woodford-Robinson (editor), and Tim Prebble (sound), all of whom embraced this approach and added to it. I was also extremely blessed to find Shanti and Emlyn so quickly in casting; they stood out a hundred miles, and from the first rehearsal it was just a question of helping them to make the characters their own. Kylie Burtland put in many after hours work to get the score done, and managed to capture the bittersweet mood of the film perfectly. Thanks to my producer Rachel Gardner, and everyone else who worked on the film, I hope you enjoy it.

Director's Bio: Michael Duignan

Michael Duignan was born in Wellington in 1977 and has been involved in the film industry for the last ten years. He worked at the now famous Embassy theatre in Wellington while studying Film and Philosophy at Victoria University. In 2001 he directed his first theatrical short film "A New Way Home" which was accepted into the Melbourne Film Festival, and won several awards in the Drifting Clouds Film Festival. That same year was accepted in to the MA program at the Australian Film, Television and Radio school in Sydney. He graduated in 2002 and since then has divided his time between Sydney and Auckland directing television commercials and developing future projects.

In the last two years she wrote and associate produced an award winning feature-length documentary on the New Zealand artist Colin McCahon "Colin McCahon: I AM", produced two series of the top rating prime time factual series "The Lion Man" and the short film "Truant", as well as managing the careers of some of New Zealand's top directors (Hamish Rothwell, Glenn Standring, Peter Burger, Brendan Donovan) and writers (Nick Ward, Duncan Sarkies, Kathryn Akuhata-Brown, Rebecca Hobbs). She has recently received NZFC funding for a second short film "Fog" to be directed by Peter Salmon.

Rachel's co-owns her film production company Maxim Films with producer Angela Littlejohn. Together they have several feature film and documentary projects in various stages of development with the NZFC and TVNZ. Rachel has a BSc (Hons) in History and Medical Sciences from University College London (Deans List) and an MSc in Policy, Law and Economics from the London School of Economics.
