Director's Notes - Catherine Bisley

The isolated setting of *Wide Eyed* could be any one of the remote rural districts I grew up in. Jade, the film's teenage protagonist, could be one of the girls I met back then, or a version of myself.

Jade is an outsider in a strange new world. Her mother has moved in with a new man. Jade wants to be accepted, but her new family situation is disturbing, and her attempts to befriend people beyond it are rebuffed. The elemental, sparsely populated environment, and the incessant river, unsettle her too. She is hemmed in by an intense natural world, the colours and sounds of which echo her unease.

Ignored by the adults, Jade and her new stepbrother Chance are thrown together. At first Jade doesn't want to have anything to do with Chance, but she comes to feel empathy for him. The situation unravels and they form an unlikely alliance; Jade rebels and Chance joins her. While her world remains precarious, Jade shows she is a force to be reckoned with.

For me, this film is frightening and hopeful. I told this story to show how girls like Jade can make it through.



Director's Bio

Catherine is a Wellington based writer and director. She grew up in rural communities around New Zealand, and is of Ngāpuhi (Te Kapotai, Ngati Hao), Danish, and Scottish descent.

In 2008 she graduated with a Master's degree in Creative Writing and a first class Honours degree in English literature (poetry) from Victoria University. Since then, she has written, directed, and co-produced two self-funded short films, the fish will swim and Alwyn Motel. Alwyn Motel premiered at the 2012 New Zealand Film Festival where it played with Berlin Golden Bear winner Caesar Must Die. Her radio play Curtains was produced by Radio New Zealand as a winner of their Student Shorts competition and her feature film script December won the New Zealand Film Commission's 2008 First Writers Initiative. She is in continued development with this project as well as her low-budget feature Exposure, which was initially developed thought the NZFC's Escalator scheme. In 2012, Catherine was awarded a scholarship that sent her to New York for three months to work for indie powerhouse Killer Films on the set on their Sundance hit Kill Your Darlings and in their thriving script department.

In addition to writing films, Catherine also pens reviews and feature articles for award winning websites The Lumiere Reader and New Zealand on Screen. She is an internationally published photographer and has worked as a script editor/story developer on a number of film projects (including Alyx Duncan's *The Red House*). She also has a strong interest in social history, which she sates by working part-time as a photograph and manuscript librarian at the Alexander Turnbull Library, New Zealand's preeminent research library.
