2 JULY 2021: OFFICIAL INFORMATION ACT REQUEST

In your letter received 2 July 2021 you requested the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

"I would like to request under the OIA all correspondence the New Zealand Film Commission has entered into or been engaged in, from any and all parties, regarding the film in development They Are Us."

Information in response to your request is set out at Appendix 1.

When there are earlier draft versions of documents, we have only provided the final version of that document. If a document has not been finalised and only exists in draft form, we have provided the draft version.

The New Zealand Film Commission (NZFC) has received three requests for information under the OIA in relation to the film *They Are Us.* Correspondence in relation to these requests fall within the timeframe of your request, however, as they do not relate specifically to the film and rather our internal processes on responding to the requests, we have not included this correspondence in our response.

The NZFC have engaged in email correspondence with the Ministry for Culture and Heritage (MCH) and the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) on drafting Written Parliamentary Questions (WPQ) in relation to the film *They Are Us.* We have not included some of this correspondence in this response as it does not relate specifically to the film and rather our internal processes. We further advise that answers to these WPQs are publicly available.

Information has been withheld where the documents or correspondence contain information outside the scope of the request or one of the withholding grounds under the OIA applies:

- Section 9(2)(a): to protect the privacy of natural persons;
- Section 9(2)(b)(ii): to protect information where the making available of the information would be likely unreasonably to prejudice the commercial position of the person who supplied or who is the subject of the information;
- Section 9(2)(ba)(i): to protect information which is subject to an obligation of confidence, where the making available of the information would be likely to prejudice the supply of similar information, or information from the same source, and it is in the public interest that such information should continue to be supplied;
- Section 9(2)(g)(i): to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions by or between or to Ministers of the Crown or members of an organisation or officers and employees of any department or organisation in the course of their duty.

- Email from Philippa Campbell to Chris Payne (NZFC), Philippa Mossman (NZFC), Leanne Saunders (NZFC), Jasmin McSweeney (NZFC) dated 14 June 2021. Withheld under s 9(2)(b)(ii), 9(2)(ba)(i) and 9(2)(a) of the OIA.
- Media list for public release attachment in email sent from Philippa Campbell to Jasmin McSweeney (NZFC) dated 14 June 2021. Withheld under s9(2)(a) of the OIA.

The NZFC initially advised MCH and MBIE – as the two Ministries to which the NZFC reports directly – that NZFC staff first engaged with the *They are Us* producing team when the team requested a meeting with the NZFC's former CEO Annabelle Sheehan in March 2020.

Following a further review of our files, we have since determined that the NZFC had initial engagement with the producers of *They Are Us* in May 2019. This correspondence is included in **Appendix 1**. Neither of the NZFC staff involved in that correspondence and meeting - specifically Annabelle Sheehan and her Executive Assistant - continue to work for the NZFC, so they had not been involved in the NZFC's provision of information in respect of the organisation's engagement with *They Are Us*.

Please note that we will be publishing this letter (with your personal information removed) and **Appendix 1** on the NZFC website.

You have the right, by way of complaint to an Ombudsman under section 28(3) of the Official Information Act, to seek an investigation and review of our response.

THEY ARE US FEATURE FILM - BACKGROUNDER

This confidential document accompanies the embargoed press release for the *They Are Us* feature film project. The press release is embargoed until 7am Friday 11 June 2021 NZT. This document provides high level additional context on the project for MCH and the Prime Minister's Office and is not for wider distribution.

Project Outline:

They Are Us takes place during the week following the Christchurch attacks on New Zealand's Muslim community, and is an inspirational story about Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern's response to the tragic events, and the remarkable achievements of her government and citizens who rallied behind her message of compassion and unity to ban assault rifles in New Zealand.

Project Genesis:

Ayman Jamal spent an extended period of time living and working in Wellington when his feature film, *Bilal: A New Breed of Hero* was being post-produced at Park Road Post Production. Following the attacks in Christchurch, he developed the idea for the film and, as part of his research, met with the Imams of each of the Al Noor Mosque and Linwood Islamic Centre Mosque, as well as many of the survivors and family members of the victims.

Jamal advises that, as a Muslim himself, the way in which Prime Minister Ardern responded to this act of terrorism is what drew him to develop the project. He notes that in the past 40 years he has not seen conflict handled in the way Prime Minister Ardern did: An approach that moved swiftly from conflict to unity, shared humanity and the coming together of community.

Jamal then approached producer Stewart Till to collaborate on the project's development. Till determined from the outset that it was essential for the project to be created out of New Zealand in partnership with experienced New Zealand filmmakers. Andrew Niccol was invited on to the project and has since written more than six drafts of the screenplay. His narrative approach is to track the key events over the week after the attacks (i.e. Friday to Friday), closely following the actions of Prime Minister Ardern. Niccol's screenplay reflects his intention to neither show the gunman's face or name him, nor detail his livestream or manifesto. Philippa Campbell has joined the producing team as the New Zealand-based producer.

Key Themes:

Heroism, Sacrifice, Humanity, Community, Leadership, Gun Control.

New Zealand Government Support:

They Are Us has been developed independently of NZFC development funding structures. However, NZFC staff—including the NZFC's former CEO, Annabelle Sheehan and Head of International Relations, Chris Payne—have been kept updated by the producing team.

The producing team is still determining their preferred approach to production financing; this will be shaped in part by the level of pre-sales and market interest the project garners following its launch at the Cannes Film Market (6-15 July 2021). The team has yet to decide and advise NZFC whether it will seek contestable NZFC Production Financing; they do intend to apply for the New Zealand Screen Production Grant (NZSPG), though whether this is the 40% grant or the 20% grant remains to be decided.

Statement from Philippa Campbell on ending involvement with They Are Us film

14 June 2021

Auckland-based film and television producer Philippa Campbell has withdrawn from the team working on the proposed film about the aftermath of the March 15, 2019 Christchurch terror attacks, *They Are Us.*

Campbell deeply regrets the shock and hurt the announcement of the film has led to throughout Aotearoa New Zealand.

"I've listened to the concerns raised over recent days and I have heard the strength of people's views. I now agree that the events of March 15, 2019 are too raw for film at this time and do not wish to be involved with a project that is causing such distress," Campbell said.

"When I was approached to work on the film I was moved by the filmmakers' vision to pay respect to the victims, their families, and those who assisted them. This was reinforced by research interviews undertaken by producer Ayman Jamal with members of the Muslim community in Christchurch. I also hoped that telling the story of swift gun control action might resonate in America and other countries that have struggled to create political consensus to control guns."

"I deeply regret the shock and hurt the announcement of the film has caused throughout Aotearoa New Zealand. The announcement was focused on film business, and did not take enough account of the political and human context of the story in this country. It's the complexity of that context I've been reflecting on that has led me to this decision."

No further comment will be provided.



As part of its function as New Zealand's national film agency, the NZFC is regularly approached by international filmmakers with projects. In the period since the March 15 mosque attacks, staff have been approached by three international filmmaking teams with projects on the topic, once of which is They Are Us. As with that project, the NZFC is not involved with either of the other two projects – they have not applied for any New Zealand Government screen funding, whether NZFC development or production funding or the NZSPG.

The NZFC received an embargoed press release from the producers on June 9th announcing the project would be introduced at the Cannes Film Market. We forwarded the release and a summary of the project and filmmakers on June 10th to the Ministry for Culture and Heritage and the Office of the Minister for Arts, Culture and Heritage (Hon Carmel Sepuloni), with the understanding that they would provide the release to the Prime Minister's Chief Press Secretary. We were advised that they did this on June 10th. The embargo lifted on June 11th at 7am New Zealand time.

For clarity - the project, They Are Us, has been developed independently of the NZFC development funding structures and there is no indication at this stage if the production will seek contestable production financing from the NZFC. We do understand that the production does intend to apply for the New Zealand Screen Production Grant (NZSPG) however, we haven't received a SPG grant application and are therefore unable to comment on the likely level of Grant or even the project's eligibility.

We were advised that they did this on June 10th.

The embargo lifted on June 11th at 7am New Zealand time.

I'm replying on our behalf here.

For clarity, noting that our earlier reply was solely in relation to the first question, having not scrolled down to the bottom of the email chain to see there were two additional questions.

Addressing each question in chronological order:

Reply 24486 (2021):

• No funding, or another incentive, has been provided by the NZFC for the proposed production of the film, *They Are Us*.

Reply 24487 (2021) [and your separate email body text questions]

- Staff first engaged with the *They Are Us* producing team when the team requested a meeting with the NZFC's former CEO, Annabelle Sheehan in **March 2020**.
- Writer/Director/Producer, Andrew Niccol emailed Annabelle Sheehan an "early draft" of the screenplay on **4 March 2020**.
- The conference call was held **on 11 March 2020** involving Sheehan, Niccol, Stewart Till and Tim White (the NZ producer attached to the project prior to Philippa Campbell's involvement).
- The brief headlines from that meeting (provided verbally to one staff member by Sheehan on **2 April 2020**):
 - 15 March terror attacks project by Andrew Niccol and Tim White.
 - Working title is *They Are Us*.
 - UAE producer <u>Ayman Jamal (Barajoun Entertainment)</u> is attached bringing funding.
 - Not set up as a co-production at this stage, but rather a solely NZ film with international finance
 - Wants the PM to read the project after the September 2020 election.
 - Was planning to shoot late summer 2021 (February/March 2021?) but likely to slide due to COVID-19.
 - Potentially interested in NZFC development funding would want to do EDF/ADF but not have to apply i.e. CEO Delegation [N.B. No funding application has been received by the NZFC.]
 - budget (US\$ or NZ\$ TBC).
- Former CEO, Annabelle Sheehan left the NZFC on **21 May 2021**.
- Staff are unaware of any further engagement on the project until **2 June 2021**, when Philippa Campbell (replacing Tim White as the NZ producer) wrote to three NZFC staff requesting a meeting "next week to introduce the project to the NZFC in more detail prior to its announcement at Cannes."
- A Teams meeting was held involving Campbell, Niccol, Till and Jamal and three NZFC staff on **9 June 2021**, during which the producing team:
 - Outlined the genesis of the project and its development process to date, including their consultation with the Canterbury Muslim community.
 - Provided an overview of the narrative and their intentions in making the film.
 - Noted the attachment of Rose Byrne to play Prime Minister Ardern.
 - Specified an estimated budget for the film but stated their uncertainty as to how the project would be financed, as this would be determined in large part by the market/financial response to the project at/following Cannes.
 - Stated that they were uncertain as to whether they would apply for NZFC production funding, but that they would likely seek to apply for NZSPG in the future though

- whether this would be the NZSPG New Zealand (40% grant) or NZSPG International (20% grant) remained to be determined.
- Advised that there had been no engagement on the part of the producing team with the Prime Minister or New Zealand Government.
- Following the meeting, on 9 June 2021 Campbell emailed staff with a copy of the embargoed
 press release, and Niccol separately emailed staff a copy of the sixth draft of the screenplay for
 optional reading, along with a brief explanatory email about one fictional character he created
 for narrative purposes.
- On 9 June 2021 staff verbally briefed the Deputy CEO of Ministry for Culture and Heritage on the meeting and that a press release would be issued by the producing team on 11 June 2021; staff were then asked to supply a written summary.
- On 10 June 2021 staff emailed the Deputy CEO of the Ministry for Culture and Heritage and the
 Private Secretary to the Minister of Arts, Culture and Heritage, Hon Carmel Sepuloni the
 embargoed press release and a backgrounder on the project and filmmakers prepared by staff.
- The Private Secretary to the Minister of Arts, Culture and Heritage, Hon Carmel Sepuloni
 confirmed on 10 June 2021 that she had shared both to the Prime Minister's Chief Press
 Secretary.
- At 7am on 11 June 2021 the embargo was lifted on the press release.
- On 15 June 2021 staff were contacted by Till via email requesting a follow-up meeting and stating that a joint press release had been issued that day by the producers and the Muslim Association of Canterbury, with this press release included with his email to staff.
- Staff met with Till on 15 June 2021 via Teams, during which Till updated staff on the
 Christchurch community consultancy approach to be employed going forward, that the press
 release had been supplied to NZ media and would be supplied to Hollywood trade media, and
 that—at this point in time—the filmmaking team remains committed to making the film.

Media Release addressing the concerns surrounding the 'They Are Us' movie.

Abdigani Ali Spokesperson Muslim Association of Canterbury (Al Noor Mosque)

"After the Muslim Association of Canterbury's media statement questioning the timing of the film and raising concerns on the focus of the film – the producers of the film have got in contact with MAC to clarify our concerns. After consultation, the producers have shared the synopsis of the movie and listened to our concerns."

"MAC acknowledges that the producers have contacted and spoken to both the Imams of Al Noor and Linwood Mosque and some of the victims of March 15th terrorist attack who came forward and shared their stories with film producers however we have come to an understanding that more consultation needs to be done with the victims of the March15th terrorist attack which includes further dialogue with Linwood Islamic Centre and the different community groups that represent the victims such as the March 15th Victim Group, Sakinah Foundation and the other ethnic community groups that also represent victims from their ethnic communities such as the Somali, Pakistani and Bengali communities just to name a few of these community groups in Christchurch."

"We have agreed to work closely with the producers to facilitate this process of consultation and any victims of the March 15th terrorist attack who are the families of the victims, the survivors or witnesses can send their request for consultation to: theyareus@masjidannur.org.nz and rest assured you will be contacted as the producers have made a commitment to work with our community in an appropriate, authentic and sensitive manner."

Ayman Jamal Producer They Are Us

"First and foremost, we are devasted by the pain and concerns caused by the announcement of the film by the members of the New Zealand public, the Muslim community of New Zealand and in particular the victims directly impacted by events of March 15th 2019 in Christchurch. This was never our intention, and we believe we owe a clarification to those families who lost their loved ones, survivors and witnesses regarding the film, its purpose and intention."

"Over a year ago we have consulted with the local Muslim community of Christchurch which included Imam Gamal Fouda of Al Noor Mosque and Imam Alabi Lateef Zikrullah of Linwood Mosque and over 20

other victims of the March 15th attack. At the time the Christchurch Muslim community was going through a lot, and we were engaging only with those families who were ready to share their story with us at that time."

THEY ARE US SYNOPSIS

THEY ARE US takes place over one remarkable week, from a Friday to a Friday. Jumu'ah to jumu'ah. From the Prayer Day when a gunman chose to murder Muslims in New Zealand to the following Prayer Day when the country chose to honour them.

In a mirror of New Zealand's own approach, during the film the gunman is never shown and his name is never spoken.

Instead, during the attack we witness the acts of heroism and sacrifice. The worshippers who confronted the gunman at Masjid Al Noor and shielded their fellow worshippers. At Masjid Aroha - Linwood Islamic Centre – we witness the courage of the unarmed worshipper, Abdul Aziz, who chased the gunman away and in doing so saved so many lives.

The Imams of the two mosques, Fouda and Zikrullah, advocating for the families of the victims, including urging that the bodies be released in accordance with the Muslim faith.

We witness the Muslim surgeon who saved the life of a four year old girl wounded in the attack and the Christchurch residents who came to the aid of worshippers.

We depict worshipper, Farid Ahmed, who very publicly forgave his wife's murderer. We depict how refugees, fleeing violence, were forced to come to terms with the cruel irony that violence claimed them in one of the safest places on earth.

And we witness the actions of Prime Minister, Jacinda Ardern, during this remarkable week. How, an hour after hearing of the attack, she instinctively penned those three simple but unforgettable words of love and solidarity, "They are us." And in this week, she achieved in six days what countries like the United States have failed to do in decades - Banning assault rifles and all weapons of war used in the attack.

"This project was developed to share these and some of the other unique 20 plus stories that the victim families have shared with us who are the real inspiring stories and heroes with the whole world. That is why we called the movie "they are us" - we wanted their stories to be heard and to make it our obligation to tell these unique stories to the world."

"There is no one hero in this film, collectively the New Zealand people from diverse backgrounds showed us, the rest of the world, that together they turned an horrific terrorist attack to unity, love and compassion by sticking together and affirming that they are all one and in this together."

"We deeply regret that we did not reach all of the families of the victims, survivors and witnesses and we want to sincerely show that we are here to listen and consult with every last victim of this tragic event who wants to express their views irrespective of what the view is and that we are ready to hear the many more inspiring stories for those who would like to share them with us. We are opening a channel of communication through the Muslim Association of Canterbury for all the families of the victims, survivors, and witnesses to email in their views, requests for consultation, requests for meetings or those who would like to share their story with us and assure them we are here to listen. 

Apologies for my delayed response.

Hello Brother is one of the projects that we are aware of. As the second project has not been publicly announced, we cannot comment on or announce the project ahead of the production company doing so. As has been advised previously, none of these three international projects has formally sought any form of New Zealand government screen funding, either NZFC discretionary development or production funding, or the New Zealand Screen Production Grant (NZSPG).

Thank you for updating your story yesterday — however, I wanted to clarify that the first part of our response to your question below referred only to the March 2020 meeting. In March 2020, the NZFC was approached by the producers of *They Are Us* for an introductory meeting. It was at a very early stage of development and, like the hundreds of other mooted film projects we are advised about, we had no reason to know at that time whether or not the project would ultimately go into production in the future, and if it did, what—if any—New Zealand government funding it might apply for. I also would like to reiterate that at that time we were advised at a high level about the production, and that there were no formal, in-depth talks about the project's finance plan or otherwise with the producers.

I am not requiring the news item be corrected, I just wanted to clarify what I said in relation to what was reported, as I don't want my comment to be interpreted as misleading in any future reporting on this topic.

Thank you for your email.

Regarding the first meeting in March 2020 and not advising the Ministry or Minister:

As part of its function as New Zealand's national film agency, the NZFC is regularly approached by local and international filmmakers with film ideas. The NZFC at any point in time is aware of hundreds of local and international mooted film projects. Most of these projects will never move into production and in March 2020 when this project first came to our attention it was at a very early stage of development and we had no reason to believe at that time that the project would go into production.

In the period since the March 15 mosque attacks, staff have been approached by three

international filmmaking teams with projects on the topic, once of which is *They Are Us*. As with that project, the NZFC is not involved with either of the other two projects – they have not applied for any New Zealand Government screen funding, whether NZFC development or production funding or the NZSPG.

The NZFC is an Autonomous Crown Entity of the New Zealand Government, and whilst we have regard to Government policy, our decisions are at arms-length from Government.
