In your email dated 26 July 2021 you requested the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

I am interested in the cocktail reception the NZFC hosted in conjunction with the New Zealand Consul-General in March 2020 in Los Angeles. Please provide:

- The venue
- The date
- The total number of guests
- The number of NZFC and Consul-General Staff who attended
- The number of NZFC staff who flew to the US for the event

I would also like a full breakdown of the FCC's expenditure on this event. Please ensure this expenditure includes, but is not limited to

- Promotional activities
- Venue hire
- Equipment hire
- Catering (broken down as per below)
 - Contractor costs
 - o Food
 - o Drinks
- Other contractors (e.g. sound, lighting)
- Speaker fees
- Accommodation
 - Hotel bookings
 - Minibar and room service
- Associated travel costs (broken down as per below)
 - Flights
 - o Taxi/chauffeur/rideshare services
 - o Travel allowances
 - Meals and entertainment

Please indicate the extent to which any of the event's costs were shared by the Consul General (and whether or not those costs have been included in the expenditure breakdown).

Answers to your specific questions are set out below.

The event was not held, it was cancelled due to COVID-19.
